CLUB GUIDELINES 2019

The **Rotary Club of Victor Harbor** is part of a worldwide organisation. Rotarians provide humanitarian service encourage high ethical standards in all vocations and help build goodwill and peace in the world. Rotary's main objective is service in the community, in the workplace and throughout the world. We are looking for people with a little or a lot time who are willing to share their time, talents, knowledge and skills with the members of the **Rotary Club of Victor Harbor**.

The primary target for a *“friend”* will be young people who will be encouraged to join as a member at a later stage OR people who may be interested and qualified for Rotary membership but are not ready to commit may become a *“friend”* for a maximum of a one year period except in special circumstances determined by the Board. They will be encouraged to become a member of this or another Rotary Club at the earliest opportunity.

Entitlements



Attend up to 8 dinner meetings. This excludes Coffee and Chat mornings.



Assist in social, fund raising, community and volunteer activities of the club.



Receive the club's bulletin.



Encourage friends to join Rotary.



A name plaque with their name and description – **“Friend of the Rotary Club Victor Harbor”**
These will be presented to the *“Friend”* at a meeting of the Rotary Club of Victor Harbor.

Guidelines for Friends

- A *“friend”* is not a member of the Rotary Club of Victor Harbor and is NOT entitled to the rights and responsibilities of membership. A *“friend”* has a formal association with the Club which provides an avenue to participate in Club activities.
- A *“friend”* may be accepted by the Board following an invitation by a member of the Club and nomination to the Board.
- A person will be a *“friend”* for a one year period, but it may be renewed and reviewed by the Board on a yearly basis. The Board may change and vary the guidelines at any time.
- A *“friend”* of Rotary shall have no vote on any decisions made by the Club nor serve on the Board and will not be entitled to wear the Rotary lapel badge.
- A *“friend”* may express a wish at any time to become a member of the Rotary Club of Victor Harbor and the usual procedures shall apply as for all new members.
- Meals and costs of other social occasions shall be the same for friends and members.
- Yearly fee of \$55.00 will be charged to cover badge, insurance etc.

THE BOARD OF ROTARY CLUB of the VICTOR HARBOR MAY AT ANY TIME CHANGE, AMEND, REMOVE OR INCLUDE NEW GUIDELINES.

Some comments on the concept of Friends of Rotary. Firstly, Friends are NOT members. Any use of a term such as “Friends Membership” is STRICTLY FORBIDDEN. Membership means payment of fees to RI and adds to our insurance payment.
